Climate Chaos response toolkit: Essential Tool kit for schools and teachers to navigate Climate Strikes.

Passionate students are not a new thing. But the recent global walkout of over 1.4million young people over the lack of Climate Action is unprecedented. This is new territory for schools—as recognised by the National Association of Headteachers with a motion earlier this month, pledging to support pupils to express their views and influence policy on climate change.

Environmental charity Global Action Plan spoke to schools who said they were uncertain of how to respond to the school strikes, and how to channel this excitement into constructive action. The charity has answered that need by launching a Climate Chaos Response Toolkit to help teachers build on the enthusiasm, meet students demands to have their voice heard in a way which is safe and manageable for the leadership team.
