## Job Description

The post holder will be responsible for the successful delivery of our Climate Leaders – the Future is Now and Paths to Leadership: Active Community Engagement (PLACE) climate and nature projects for CDEC.

Climate Leaders – the Future is Now is funded through Cumbria Community Foundation

Paths to Leadership: Active Community Engagement (PLACE) climate and nature is funded through Westmorland and Furness Council and is a partnership project, including Another Way, Cumbria Action for Sustainability, Lakeland Arts and Cumbria Biodiversity Data Centre.

As part of the role, they will also have a responsibility to support schools with embedding Global Learning within their curriculum and approaches. The Climate Leaders project and other work will be delivered across Cumbria. We are offering this as an initial 12 month contract but are actively seeking additional funding to be able to extend the contract to become permanent.

The post holder will become a full member of the CDEC team. They will work closely with our Schools Programmes Co-ordinator, Admin, Finance and Comms Officer as well as the Director, on the delivery of key elements of the project, as well as building positive relationships with schools and youth groups, project partners, participants and service providers.

#### 3 key strands of delivery for these projects

## Working with schools and youth groups

- Work with a minimum of 10 schools delivering a programme of support to develop and embed climate action within the school curriculum and through youth-led climate action projects
  - This will include delivery of the Climate Curriculum CPD (training and support provided)
  - Support teachers to implement a programme of activities to allow pupils to audit their school to identify their actions; this support will be virtual as well as in-person
  - Support schools (teachers and pupils) to meet and share
  - Support schools to connect with local/regional/national organisations who can be part of developing the sustainability of their climate action plans
  - Support schools to develop their sustainability leads and climate action plans (in line with DfE strategy and National Education Nature Park)







### Working directly with young people to connect and build capacity- networking and events

- Our target is to work with/ develop 2 active groups of young people:
  - o via their schools, youth groups and other networks/ partners (eg: Another Way and the Power of 10 app or via Duke of Edinburgh groups) to facilitate conversations and support them both to organise and develop ideas, and also to implement them.

We will offer training, as well as mentoring and activities that connect participants with nature and people. The focus is longer-term action by ensuring young people have the skills and connections to take their ideas and put them into action. Through the project, participants will cocreate a range of tools and activities that focus on leadership, project planning, empowering young people (and by extension, communities) and getting their voice heard. They will have the opportunity to build their networks and confidence and to mitigate any climate anxiety and mental health concerns. Connect groups of young people with other organisations and communities that can support sustainable projects and action

#### **Events:**

Through our projects and engagements above, we will hold a minimum of 3 events that bring young people together so they can share, network and grow their own skills and ideas. The post holder will also co-ordinate the annual Youth Climate Summit, which is part of the Zero Carbon Cumbria Programme.

### **Key Responsibilities**

The post holder will be responsible for the overall management of the project. This will require them to:

- Manage delivery of all aspects of Climate Leaders- the Future is Now and PLACE- climate and nature projects
- Ensure project objectives are delivered on time and within budget
- Plan, manage and deliver a range of events- including the Youth Climate Summit and young people's networking and training events
- Design and deliver workshops with participants, liaise with project partners, manage the budget and work alongside CDEC colleagues
- Coordinate and oversee production of core project outputs, in partnership with the project participants and communities involved, within the project time scale
- Recruit schools/youth groups and direct project participants (young people) and liaise with community groups/members in each locality
- build support into schools and youth groups- through education resources and CPD for adults, so the approach is embedded as each new cohort of young people come through.
- Manage relations with key partner organisations (eg: CAfS, Another Way, Lakeland Arts, CBDC)
- Create a series of resources and activities that are included in the final materials produced by the project







- Report regularly on progress to Schools Programme Director and CDEC Director
- Work with the CDEC Admin, Finance and Comms Officer to ensure that the project is widely promoted and that finance reporting is in place
- Meet all funder reporting requirements, including both interim and final summative reports
- Undertake any other aspects that can be reasonably required by the Director in implementing the project

- Full UK driving licence and the willingness to travel to diverse and sometimes remote locations in Cumbria
- Willingness and flexibility to work evenings, if requested/required
- Commitment to the principles and purposes of Cumbria Development Education Centre

- Experience of working in outdoor settings, engaging participants with climate education or leadership and social action
- Experience of enquiry-based approaches (eg: P4C)
